## Leica Camera Announces Call for Entries and Regional Expansion of its 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Leica Women Foto Project Award

This year's award expands to residents US, UK, Mexico, and Canada, where one winner from each region will be selected to receive a Leica SL2-S camera set and \$10,000 USD for use towards the completion of a personal project that bears witness to humanity

**September 23rd 2022** – Leica Camera announces today the fourth annual call for entries to its annual *Leica Women Foto Project Award*. This year, the brand's initiative to promote diversity in photography expands to new regions across the globe. For the first time ever, Leica Camera will accept entries from the United Kingdom, Mexico, and Canada in addition to the United States, to award one winner per region a Leica SL2-S camera, a Vario-Elmarit-SL 24-70mm f/2.8 ASPH. Lens, and cash prize of \$10,000 USD. Applicants are requested to submit a photo story made with any make or model camera (owning a Leica is not required) that bears witness to humanity as expressed through the female perspective. Submissions will be selected by a diverse group of jurors renowned in the world of photography. The growth of the award serves to expand the possibilities of female stories that can be told and cultures that can be explored through the art of photography.

Since its inception in 2019, the *Leica Women Foto Project* continues to serve as a platform to cultivate a diverse and inclusive community through photography. Its mission is to encourage photographers to demonstrate the importance and impact of a woman's point of view. The award serves as a catalyst to reframe how we see, think, and express our visual narrative. To date, the initiative has fueled diversity in visual storytelling through grants and sponsorships with *Women Photograph*, *Photoville*, *Las Fotos Project*, *ConnectHer Film Festival* and co-created the *Leica Women Foto Project Grant* for the *Leica Historical Society's* own philanthropic efforts. This spring,

the *Leica Women Foto Project* will co-create a series of panel talks with the British Journal of Photography to explore the impact of diversity behind the lens on the way we see our world. *The initiative* will also amplify the female perspective through partnerships with She Clicks, Equal Lens and Wallpaper\* with additional programmes to be launched throughout the year.

"Photography has the power to give reason for hope: Don't look the other way, shake things up, express and advocate for change – the connection to humanity and our responsibility to bear witness to its moments is at the heart of Leica's culture – from the *Leica Oskar Barnack Award* to the *Leica Women Foto Project Award*. With these initiatives, we recognise and celebrate the courageous photographers and the stories they express through their unique lens" states Art Director for Leica Galleries Worldwide and LWFP Juror, Karin Rehn-Kaufmann
